CAT CONTROL VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Cat traps may be soon set in Lincoln National Park, after they have been picked up on remote cameras as part of predator surveys and our Malleefowl monitoring. Staff will be asking for volunteers to help out with checking the traps as it is a labour intensive activity.

Once the traps are deployed in the park, they will need to be checked every day, probably for a week at a time. Checking would be organised on a roster basis.
